#### KOSHER KIWI KIDS SCHOOL LUNCH PROGRAM

- Works through the National School Lunch Program and School Free and Reduced Lunch Application Processing
- 49% of participating students qualify & receive Free or Reduced Lunch
- 70% of families who don't qualify for government aid receive private subsidies
- 1,600 meals served meals daily,
- 1 million meals served since launched in June 2014
- 7 schools being serviced EXPANDED 2017
- Exclusive Commissary Kitchen for kosher cooking and preparation

# ★ SECURING COMMUNITY INSTITUTIONS & FIGHTING ANTI-SEMITISM

- Many of the synagogues and schools in the Orthodox Jewish community are located in areas classified as high risk by federal and state agencies.
- Anti-Semitism is on the rise. Bomb threats to Jewish institutions and anti-Semitic incidents have recently spiked, including instances in the Chicago area.
- These incidents and threats are a source of concern and angst for many in the Jewish community.
- HB 4011, HB 4012 SOS-Emergency Security Grants: Sponsored by Representative Lang and numerous co-sponsors, this bill provides a \$25 million appropriation for security grants to at-risk not-for-profit organizations to assist in preventing, preparing for, or responding to attacks.
- HB 2390: Agudath Israel of Illinois supports strengthening Illinois' Hate Crime Law by increasing penalties for acts of vandalism against houses of worship and religious centers.
- Agudath Israel of Illinois supports the Governor's initiatives to improve law enforcement training and response on hate crimes, to expand the curriculum in schools that educate students about the Holocaust, and to strengthen Illinois' anti-BDS law by prohibiting state contracts for companies that boycott Israel.



# ★ TAX CREDIT SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

- Agudath Israel of Illinois represents more than 5,000 students attending Jewish day schools in the Chicago area. The overwhelming majority of these students and many others who wish to attend Jewish day schools require some type of financial aid.
- A scholarship tax credit program will encourage individuals and businesses to invest in education and assist and enable thousands of children to attend a school of their choice.
- A well-crafted scholarship tax credit program would help retain and attract and many working families to the State of Illinois, driving economic growth and development.



## **\*** EDUCATION FUNDING

- Two extremely beneficial programs used to assist nonpublic school students. The Illinois Textbook Loan Program (ITLP) provided textbooks for public and nonpublic school students. A transportation grant for schools represented by Agudath Israel was in place for nearly a decade. The ITLP was terminated in 2010 and the transportation grant was discontinued in 2015. With the loss of two major state-funded benefits, students attending Jewish day schools have experienced setbacks instead of progress. Tax paying parents are saving the state millions of dollars by paying privately for their children's education, but the financial burden is becoming increasingly difficult, and for many, unsustainable.
- Agudath Israel of Illinois is seeking a measure of relief for parents who send their children to private schools in the form of an increase to the education tax credit from \$500 to \$750.
- SB 9 included such an increase. Despite the fact that the bill has not been able to advance, Agudath Israel views the Senate's bipartisan consensus behind its passage as an indication that an increase to the education tax credit is agreeable to lawmakers from both parties.
